We recognise the challenges many families are facing with the current rising cost of living. With this in mind, we have kept our curriculum contributions as low as possible while still ensuring that Caulfield South Primary can continue to offer a rich and engaging learning environment. Your ongoing support enables us to provide vital resources, additional programs, and an engaging learning environment for all students. Some of the key projects you will be supporting in 2025 include:

- Expanding the highly impactful 'Little Learners Love Literacy' reading program for prep to year 2 and extending 'novel-study' texts in Years 3 to 6.
- Enhancing the 'Primary Maths Specialist Program' to further develop our teachers' expertise and resources to support the delivery of a highly-effective mathematics program.
- Continuing our membership of the International Baccalaureate to deliver the Primary Years Programme (PYP).
- Build on the variety of resources for our comprehensive & engaging STEM program, including further development of the coding and robotics programs.
- Completion of the major redevelopment of the senior playground, alongside continuing upgrading of playground areas, gardens and sports areas across the school.
- Upkeep of the traditional building in the school, including further carpeting and painting works.
- Completion of the installation of shade sails in the quadrangle.
- Replacement of water troughs and drinking taps throughout the school.
